AIB RECEIVES EMMY NOMINATION FOR SOUND OF YOUTH

Atlanta, GA, May 13, 2009 - For the second year in a row, an AIB original program has been nominated for an Emmy by the Southeast Regional Chapter of the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences. The AIB original series ***Sound of Youth*** received this year's nomination. ***Sound of Youth – Lupe Fiasco*** was nominated in the category of Outstanding Achievement - Television News and Program Specialty Excellence.

The episode aired in September, 2008 and featured concert footage and interviews with Grammy award winner Lupe Fiasco and rising teen star, Karina from the *Coca-Cola Refresh Your Flow Tour*.
